The meeting opened with introductions of the Alaska Regional Response Team (ARRT) members and other meeting attendees, including those participating via teleconference. Mr. Everett provided an overview of recent actions since the last ARRT meeting. He highlighted recent work on the logistics planning for a Spill of National Significance (SONS) on the arctic region (see links below).

Ms. Kelly McFarlin, a PhD student at the University of Alaska Fairbanks presented on her research on the biodegradation and toxicity of chemically dispersed oil. Her presentation is not available for public release, however; two papers associated with her presentation are available (see links below).

CAPT Dan Travers (USCG) updated the ARRT on the progress of the Dispersants Working Group. The plan has been submitted to the Services (USFWS/NMFS) for consultation in accordance with Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act. The dispersant use guidelines are expected to be completed by fall of 2014.

CDR Ben Hawkins (USCG, FOOSC – Prince William Sound) provided an overview of the upcoming Prince William Sound SeaRiver Exercise scheduled for September 16-18, 2014. This will be a 56-hour exercise to be held in Valdez, AK. (see links below)

Ms. Marcia Combes (EPA, ARRT Liaison) offered an update on the ESA Consultation Working Group. The Biological Assessment, which will incorporate the proposed dispersant use plan, has been submitted to the Services. The USFWS has requested additional information. A request for additional information was received from USFWS, and one is also expected from NMFS. She anticipates that the Biological Opinions will be complete and required modifications incorporated to the Unified Plan by fall 2014. Consultation with NMFS regarding Essential Fish Habitat is underway, in accordance with the Magnuson-Stevens Fisheries Management Act.

Ms. Combes also updated the ARRT on activities of the Science and Technology Committee (STC). The STC has been reestablished. Among the recent tasks of the committee, they addressed a number of comments on the Dispersant Use Plan and have completed a new STC charter.

Mr. Chris Field offered some thoughts and observations on the ARRT role in a Stafford Act response. In April 2014, the Alaska Shield exercise was held and the ARRT was activated. EPA staff is currently working to compile and address lessons learned from their involvement in Alaska Shield. Mr. Field addressed some of these issues and addressed the differences in response between an OPA response and Stafford Act response.

Mr. Nick Knowles updated the ARRT on the status of revisions to the Interior Subarea Contingency Plan. The plan expected to go out for public review and be completed this summer.

Mr. Jason Lehto (NOAA Fisheries) gave a presentation on the Assessment of Marine Oil Spill Risk and Environmental Vulnerability for the State of Alaska. The analysis is expected to be completed in August/September 2014. He reviewed the elements of the assessment: oil spill probabilities and environmental vulnerability (see link below).

LT Matthew Mitchell (USCG) presented on recent activities of Sector Anchorage in preparation for approval of Alternate Planning Criteria for non-tank vessels, and the upcoming Aleutian Islands PREP exercise. The PREP exercise scenario will be an incident in Dutch Harbor, and is scheduled for September 2014. (see link below)

Mr. Steve Russell (ADEC, SOSOC South-Central) updated the ARRT on the status of ongoing wildfires in South-central Alaska at Tyonek and Funny River on the Kenai Peninsula. He also updated the RRT on the status of updates to the existing Regional Stakeholder Committee (RSC) policy. On-Scene Coordinators engaged in this project have been in communication with ARRT members who submitted comments on the draft proposed policy. The OSC Working Group continues to work on the policy. One of the major revisions under consideration is the relocation of policy language contained in Appendix 8 of Annex E of the Unified Plan, to Annex E, Appendix 2. An updated draft is expected by the end of June 2014 for approval by the ARRT and submission for public review.

Mr. Lee Majors presented information regarding the recent report from the National Research Council, entitled "Responding to Oil Spills in the U.S. Arctic Marine Environment." (see link below). Ms. Pamela Bergman provided an update on activities of the Wildlife Protection Committee, the CANUSDIX Wildlife Response Working Group and CANUSDIX Resource Agency Working Group. There was no news to report on the ARRT Cultural Resources Committee (see links below).

Mr. Knowles reported on the Tribal Standard Operating Guidance "ARRT Guidelines for Coordination and Consultation with Federally-recognized Tribes." The document was finalized on April 3, 2014. Among the contents of this document are guidelines for how tribes can participate as members of the ARRT. Members of the public attending the meeting were invited to offer public comments. Dr. John French of Pegasus Environmental delivered comments.

ARRT members were invited to offer closing comments, followed by the Co-chairs offering their closing comments.

In their closing comments, the co-chairs noted the request from the Interior Subarea Committee to have the *In Situ Burn* (ISB) Guidelines revised and expanded to include a checklist specific to ISB on inland waters and on land. Mr. Everett also remarked that an item that should have been noted in the status report of work and accomplishments since the last meeting, was the approval of the new version of the ARRT charter. Nine member agencies voted their support for the revisions (EPA, USCG, FEMA, DOC/NOAA, DOD, DOT, DHHS, USDA/USFS, and the State of Alaska). The final draft will be signed by the tri-chairs, and posted to the ARRT website.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:30 p.m.




Dear Mr. Everett and Mr. Field:

This letter is in response to Mr. Nick Knowles' June 12, 2014, email in which he provided to Alaska Regional Response Team (ARRT) members for their review, the draft summary of the May 21, 2014, ARRT meeting. My comments are as follows:

Science and Technology Committee (STC) Report by Ms. Marcia Combes:

Page 1, Paragraph 6, last sentence, "Among the recent tasks of the committee, they addressed a number of comments on the Dispersant Use Plan and have completed a new STC charter." This summary needs to be revised to include (1) Ms. Combes' additional statement that the ARRT Co-Chairs had approved the STC Charter and that the charter would be subsequently posted on the ARRT web site and (2) Ms. Pamela Bergmann's subsequent "point of order" that in accordance with the Article VII, Section 1 (Establishment) of the ARRT Charter, the next step for the revised STC Charter is submittal to the entire ARRT (not just the ARRT Co-Chairs) for review and approval. The meeting summary needs to be revised to also reflect that there were no objections made, by the ARRT Co-Chairs or any other ARRT member, to the procedural point raised by Ms. Bergmann.

Closing Comments by Mr. Everett – ARRT Charter:

Page 3, Paragraph 1, Sentence 3, "Nine member agencies voted their support for the revisions (EPA, USCG, FEMA, DOC/NOAA, DOD, DOT, DHHS, USDA/USFS, and the State of Alaska)." As is noted in the attached May 29, 2014, email correspondence, Mr. Everett did not identify which ARRT "member agencies voted their support for the revisions" at the ARRT meeting. Therefore, the summary needs to be corrected to eliminate the list of agencies who "voted their support for the revisions" and to make it clear that there was no vote on the charter during the May 21, 2014, ARRT meeting.

List of Other Attendees:

In accordance with Article V, Section IV (Records) of the ARRT Charter, the meeting summary should note which ARRT members did not attend in addition to "other attendees." The meeting summary needs to be revised to include this information.

While I appreciate that Mr. Knowles requested that ARRT members provide comments to him within 7 calendar days (i.e., by the close of business on June 19, 2014), Article V, Section 4 of the ARRT charter provides ARRT members 30 days to provide comments to the ARRT Coordinators. The specific provision reads: "Within 30 days of receipt of the initial meeting summary, ARRT members shall review and may provide comments to the ARRT Coordinators." Therefore I am requesting that these comments be part of the meeting record.

Sure. As Chris and I have indicated over the past several ARRT meetings, we felt strongly that some of the terms of the ARRT Charter created unnecessary administrative burden and allowed 'process' to trump 'productivity' – ultimately eroding ARRT credibility vital to meeting our NCP-based mandates.

Although advised by our respective legal staffs to simply vacate the charter – and noting much worthwhile content in it – we sought to modify instead. The attached version was proposed and discussed at the 29 January ARRT meeting and subsequently modified based on post-meeting feedback from several ARRT member agencies, including DOI. Chris and I then engaged each of the member agencies individually to gain their perspective and gauge their support.

As required by Article X the previous charter, this version was subsequently approved by ARRT reps from FEMA, DOC/NOAA, DOD, DOT, DHHS, USDA/USFS, USEPA, USCG, and ADEC. It has been signed by EPA and USCG. Because of the strong federal-state partnership we have through ADEC, we added a signature block for Kristin Ryan; she will sign when she returns to the office. Once she does, I'll send out the final to all ARRT members, copy the NRT, and have it posted on the ARRT website.

Hope this helps clarify. Happy to discuss further.

Nick - For the sake of accuracy of the record, please append this email to the 21 May ARRT Meeting minutes as well.

With reference to Ms. Bergmann's 25 June 2014 comments to the Draft ARRT Meeting Summary:

Science and Technology Committee (STC) Report by Ms. Marcia Combes: Ms. Bergmann's point is moot. The new charter (Article VII) -- which had already been approved at the time of Ms. Combes' briefing -- does not ***require*** workgroups to be chartered; they ***may*** be chartered. Nor does the new charter require such optional workgroup charters to be voted on by the ARRT.

Closing Comments by Mr. Everett - ARRT Charter: 1) As a matter of following proper procedure, Ms. Bergmann's assertion obfuscates requirements: The previous version of the charter (27 Jan 2010) at Article IX does not require a vote ***during an ARRT meeting*** only that changes "will be approved by at least eight ARRT members." 2) As a matter of ensuring correctness of the record, Ms. Bergmann's comments are correct, but misguided: ARRT Meeting Summaries are not verbatim transcripts. They are, in fact, summaries. While I did not specifically verbalize which agencies voted for the charter revision, I did provide that information to the meeting recorder during a meeting break for inclusion in the record and only summarized the result of the approval process during my closing comments. [Errata: in the third paragraph of the 29 May 2014 email from me that Ms. Bergmann appended to her comments, I mistakenly typed "Article X" instead of "Article IX."]

Finally, I concur with Ms. Bergmann on the point of allowing ARRT members 30 days from initial receipt to provide comments on ARRT Meeting Summaries (as per Article V, Section 4 of the new charter).
